Born in Ireland, Brosnan studied acting at the Drama Center in London. His stage career was launched when he was personally cast by Tennessee Williams to create the role of McCabe in the British premiere of *Red Devil Battery Sign*.

In 1986 he made his critically acclaimed motion picture debut in John McTiernan's (*Die Hard*, *The Hunt for Red October*) thriller *Nomads*. His other screen appearances include starring roles in *The Fourth Protocol*, *The Deceivers*, the NBC-TV mini-series *Noble House* and *Taffin*. Brosnan has appeared on both British and American television in the BBC series *Nancy Astor*, for which he was awarded a Golden Globe nomination.
